

This publication is a 2020/2021 resource book for our choir members and their families. It provides Choir Policies, a Calendar of Events and a Roster.

# **Attendance Policy**

All choir members are expected to punctually attend the appropriate rehearsals and Sunday masses. To be excused from a choir event, parents must write a note or phone the Music Office. Unexcused absences are followed up with a phone call. This is to ensure the safety of a child who is "missing" from rehearsal. After four unexcused absences, a meeting must be held between the director, parent and chorister before continuing in the choir program.

# Vestments

Each choir member is assigned a choir number, which identifies his cubby, songbooks and robes. Each member is provided a cassock and surplice (long purple robe and white short robe, respectively). The choir member is responsible for making sure cassocks/surplices are clean and neat for every performance. Probationers will receive cassocks and surplices in the Fall but only wear the cassock until they are invested with a surplice in March. These vestments are hung in numerical order in the Music Office and remain there unless they are taken to be cleaned or mended. PLEASE DO NOT REMOVE TAGS AS THEY SHOW THE NAME/NUMBER FOR THE SINGERS. Choir medals are kept with the vestments. Please be sure to have the Choir # and name of the chorister affixed with tape on both the robe and surplice for Identification.

# **Dress Code**

Although the choir members wear cassocks and surplices over their street clothes for Sunday masses, it is important that they look professional and neat when the choir performs. Proper dress for Sunday Liturgies includes a dress shirt, dress pants, socks, and dress shoes. This dress code is even more significant if the choir is singing at engagements outside the church. For special occasions, it may be necessary for each member to wear the "choir uniform." This is basically a pair of Khaki dress pants, a white polo/golf shirt or dress shirt and a navy blue blazer. A number of blazers are available in the Music Office for those boys who don't already own one.

# Safety

Please park on Quealy Place when picking up boys after rehearsals. In the unlikely event that a choir member is not claimed within a few minutes after rehearsal, they will wait in the RECTORY OFFICE and may be picked up there.

# Liturgy and Rehearsal Schedule

The Men and Boys Choir usually sings every third Sunday at the televised 11:00 Liturgy. On these Sundays, Tenors and Basses are expected to arrive at 9:45 and Sopranos and Altos should arrive at 10:15 for "warm-up" rehearsals. There are several special liturgies the Choir will participate in during the year and they are highlighted on the accompanying **Calendar of Events**. Please take the choir calendar into consideration when planning family vacations, especially around the Christmas and Easter holidays.

Regular weekly rehearsals will vary for each choir member depending on his status in the choir (Group A-probationer, Group B-2nd year 4th Gr., or Advanced), his singing section (soprano, also, tenor and bass) and his school schedule (St. Agnes boys are available to sing at earlier daytime rehearsals than public school boys).

#### **Probationers:**

Probationers are taught the basics of being a choirboy: how to process with a group; how to hold music; discipline at Mass and rehearsals, etc. In addition, probationers receive individual instruction in vocal production and learn how to read

Choir, their schedule remains the same as they continue their studies in vocal production and sight singing until they pass all requirements for the Junior level.

#### Sopranos and Altos (Juniors, Seniors, Choristers):

The terms Junior, Senior and Chorister denote different levels of achievement within the soprano and alto sections. At all three levels, boys are considered full singing members of the choir. *Choristers* have achieved the highest standards of musical and disciplinary excellence and serve as examples for the younger members. A *Select Ensemble* of the advanced singers of the alto and soprano section, *(and tenor & basses sections)* sings for additional liturgies, concerts and special events. Juniors display their medals on light blue ribbons; seniors on dark blue ribbons and choristers have red ribbons.

# **Choir Organization**

The choir is divided into teams. Team leaders are chosen by the choir director to be in charge of each team. Team leaders are expected to help the members of their teams and to set a good example. They wear special team leader medals (silver) on red ribbons. An outstanding team leader may qualify to become a head chorister. The choir director also appoints one or two head choristers and one or two deputy head choristers as the soprano and alto section's leaders. The Head Chorister(s) wear(s) a red ribbon with a large gold medal. Outstanding graduating 8th graders may become Bishops Chorister and receive a wide green ribbon and a large medal, which is the highest honor bestowed on a chorister.

# <u>Point System</u>

Each choir member is encouraged to be a responsible, contributing member of the choir. Points are awarded at the end of each rehearsal, liturgy or performance to indicate the choir members' level of participation, punctuality, and effort. Points may be subtracted for bad behavior or lack of punctual attendance. The minimum number of points required for each level in the soprano and alto sections are as follows:

JUNIOR Light Blue Ribbon and Bronze	Medal 90 POINTS
SENIOR Dark Blue Ribbon and Bronze	Medal 180 POINTS
CHORISTER Red Ribbon and Bronze Me	dal 325 POINTS
<b>TEAM LEADER:</b> Red Ribbon and Silver M	
(outstanding leadership skills—music, repert	oire, etc)

HEAD CHORISTER: Wide Red Velvet and Large Gold Medal 615 POINTS (Head of Team Leaders and singers)

**BISHOP'S CHORISTER:** Wide Green Ribbon and Large Gold Medal! Upon completion of 8th Grade, and going to High School! To be worn and as h.s. member!

CHORAL SCHOLAR: Wide Purple Ribbon and Large Gold Medal! Boys/Teens who continue to sing the soprano/alto part at the beginning of high school years!

# **Group A - Probationer Schedule**

Similar to the probationer schedule, the Group B Boys (2<sup>nd</sup> Year Boys) will be responsible for attending their appropriate Monday rehearsal while attending rehearsals on scheduled Thursday evenings (5:30-7:45/includes dinner) prior to the Sundays when the Choir is expected to perform (usually every third Sunday-there are exceptions!) as well as the corresponding Sunday Liturgy itself (11:00). In addition, Group B boys are responsible to rehearse/sing on December 10th, or 17th and 25th (Christmas), Jan 31st(Catholic Schools Wk), February 11th and 25th, Sunday, February 28th (Investiture), March 4th or 11th (Chrism Mass Practice Tentative), March 25th, March 28th, ? #### **Choir History**

The St. Agnes Cathedral Parish Choir of Men and Boys was founded in 1960 at the request of the recently appointed 1st Bishop of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, the late Most Reverend Walter P. Kellenberg. A highlight of that first year was their singing at Midnight Mass in the Cathedral. The Choir has had a distinguished career, which has included widespread performances and outstanding conductors. They have three studio recordings to their credit.

Entrance into the choir is by audition/interview only. Boys attend the Cathedral school and other schools in Rockville Centre and neighboring communities. The Choir has a training group of about 12 younger singers, mainly 3rd grade probationers (training group voices) and about 35 advanced singers (sopranos and altos) who rehearse twice a week. The treble singers follow the Royal School of Church Music training scheme for achievement/rewards in relation to their participation in the group. The tenor and bass singers are made up of 20 voluntary trained choral singers from the Parish and experienced high school boys from the soprano and alto sections (changed voices) who rehearse twice a week. The Choir regularly sings for the 11:00 AM Sunday Mass in the Cathedral, as well as special services, concerts, and other events. Previous directors include Paul LaMedica and Christoph Tietze. Under their leadership, the Choir performed at the Kennedy Center under the direction of Leonard Bernstein, the White House, the National Shrine in Washington, D.C., and cathedrals in six states and four European countries, including the Cathedral in Cologne, Germany. During a 1988 tour of Italy, the Choir was featured at an international congress of church musicians and was honored with a Papal audience.

For the past 27 years the Choir has continued to flourish under the direction of Michael L. Bower. The Choir has performed at St. Patrick's Cathedral, Avery Fisher Hall, Lincoln Center, The White House, St. Thomas Church, Fifth Avenue, New York City, The Cathedral Basilica in Ottawa, Canada, Shea Stadium for a Mets baseball game, CNN's Larry King Live Show, and with the Nashville Children's Choir. The Choir regularly takes a select concert ensemble on various regional tours. Singers from the Choir have performed in many professional organizations, including the Phil Donahue Show, the New York City Opera, various commercials and TV shows, and regional theater and opera companies. In 2002 the Choir sang Handel's "Messiah" with the South Shore Symphony of Rockville Centre. They also recorded a new Christmas CD with the Cathedral's new pipe organs. The Choir has appeared in master-class with James O'Donnell of Westminster Abbey, London, and John Romeri of the Cathedral Basilica of Philadelphia.

In 2004, they traveled on a concert tour to Washington D.C. and Virginia, singing at the most prestigious places in Roanoke and Williamsburgh. The Choir performed Mozart's "Requiem" for the one-year anniversary of the death of His Holiness Pope John Paul II (on April 2 of 2006). The Trebles sang Mahler's "Symphony No. 3" with the South Shore Symphony. The Choir also traveled on concert tour to New England in June of the same year.

More recently, the Choir performed the National Anthem at Yankee Stadium and Shea Stadium and a Christmas Concert at the Lynbrook Library Performing Arts Hall. In 2008, the Choir traveled to Washington, D.C., on a concert tour to sing at the White House and the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and in September, performed a benefit concert for St. Agnes Cathedral Elementary School with the famous Irish tenor, Ronan Tynan. In the 2008-2009 Year, The Choir sang Beethoven's "Ninth Symphony" and performed at Citfield on July 8. For the 2009-2010 season, the Choir sang Handel's "Messiah" under Maestro Bower in December, and performed in a private master-class with Dr. Bruce Neswick of the Cathedral St. John the Divine, New York City in February.

In the Spring of 2011, the Choir performed in the Cathedral's Franz Liszt Music Festival and sang the National Anthem at Citifield. In the Fall of 2011, the Choir performed Rutter's "Requiem" for a 9/11 10th Anniversary Memorial and recorded a new professional Christmas CD. In the 2012-2013 season, the Choir traveled on Concert Tour to Italy, performed in a Master-Class with Martin Baker from Westminster Cathedral, England, sang in a professional Christmas Show at Westbury Music Fair with Fr. Charles and Laurie Mangano, a multifaceted Christmas Concert in St. Agnes Cathedral, a Choir Festival in Southampton, and at Citifield

For 2013-2014, events included the Hallmark Christmas Concert at St. Patrick's Cathedral, Fifth Avenue, New York City, presenting a Mozart Mass in St. Agnes with professional soloists and orchestra. The 2014-2015 season included a Christmas Concert and a concert tour to Ireland/England, and the premier performance at Madison Square Garden! And The Long Island Ducks! 2015-2016: the advanced Singers performed Handel's "Messiah" and a concert at Carnegie Hall! Last Season: a 9/11 15th Anniversary Concert of John Rutter's "Requiem," a Concert at St. Francis Xavier Parish, New York City, and Citifield & Long Island Ducks.

Season of 2017-2018: SeptemberFest! on 9/15, the Sistine Chapel Choir Exchange, the Cathedral Christmas Concert, the Diocesan Schools Mass on the Fest of St. Agnes, and the Concert Tour to Germany, Austria and Prague. 2018-2019: Long Island Festival Trees, Mozart's "Requiem" Concert, National Anthem on August 9 to a Citifield, and winning Game!, viewed by 37,000 people in the stadium!

In the spirit of Mr. Bower's alma mater (Westminster Choir College), the Choir of Men and Boys is made up of a dedicated group of singers who strive to sing with the best quality and professionalism possible.

**Michael L. Bower**, Conductor and organist, continues to enjoy the privilege of directing this wonderful group of talented musicians here on Long Island! A native of Floyd, Virginia, he began formal piano lessons at age six and was playing for Sunday school services in his home church by 12. He began teaching himself to play the organ at age 13 and held his first position as church organist at Zion Lutheran Church in Floyd at age 15.

Mr. Bower received his Bachelor's Degree Magna Cum Laude in Sacred Music and Organ Performance from Westminster Choir College, Princeton, where he studied organ with Donald McDonald, harpsichord with Mark Brombaugh, and conducting with Joseph Flummerfelt. He was a three-time recipient of the William and Mary Renneckar merit scholarship. During his undergraduate years, Mr. Bower pursued additional organ study with Marilyn Keiser of Indiana University and boys choir training with James Litton, Director of the American Boys Choir, Princeton and Gerre Hancock, St. Thomas Church, Fifth Avenue, New York. He was also a member of Donald Allured's Concert Handbell Choir. In 1985, he was appointed Associate Director of Music for St. Agnes Cathedral. At this time, he assisted Christoph Tietze in the development of a professional music program, including multiple choirs. He founded the Cathedral Girls Choir and trained the probationer group of the Boys Choir. In 1987, Bower continued specialized studies in organ and boys choir training with Stephen Cleobury at Kings College, Cambridge, and conducting with John Rutter at Clare College, Cambridge, England.

Michael earned his Master's Degree with Honors in Organ Performance from Manhattan School of Music in 1992, where he studied organ with John Walker, Baroque continuo with Kenneth Cooper, and conducting with Amy Keiser. At graduation, Bower received the John Cerovalo award for his outstanding performance of the music of Johann Sebastian Bach. He has also done graduate work in liturgy at Notre Dame University and the National Pastoral Musicians Institute. Bower has performed organ recitals on the East Coast, the Mid-West, Germany, Austria, Italy, France, and England. He has performed on the organ at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City and with the Long Island Choral Society of Garden City, New York. Bower also performed Ned Rorem's "Quaker Reader" in a concert at Columbia University as part of a festival celebrating the composer's 75<sup>th</sup> birthday in 1998. Michael is featured on the Christmas CD of the Cathedral Choir of Men and Boys released in December 2002, playing five solo organ selections. He has been a regional workshop clinician in choral vocal production, boys choirs, and organ performance.

Michael's duties at St. Agnes Cathedral include directing the 75-voice Choir of Men and Boys, the 80-voice Cathedral Chorale (Adult), and the Schola Cantorum (16-voice a capella ensemble), and the Cathedral Singers (extremely vocally gifted octet ensemble of the Cathedral's professional singers). Most recently, he has created the Diocesan Boys Choir of Rockville Centre. Mr. Bower has prepared and conducted the Cathedral Choras and Orchestra in performances of many choral masterworks including Handel's *Messiah*, Beethoven's *Mass in C*, Haydn's *Harmoniemesse*, and Mozart's *Requiem*. He has also toured with the Choir of Men and Boys to sing at Avery Fisher Hall, Lincoln Center, St. Thomas Church, Fifth Avenue, New York City, The White House, and the Cathedral Basilica of Ottawa, Ontario, Canada. In 1998, he prepared the Cathedral Chorale for a performance at Carnegie Hall conducted by John Rutter. In 2000, Michael prepared the Chorale and other Rockville Centre choral singers for a Millennium performance of Beethoven's *Ninth Symphony*. Michael was the Dean of the Nassau County Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, Chair of the International Conference of Roman Catholic Cathedral Musicians, and past member of the Diocesan Liturgy Commission of Rockville Centre.

Other projects of Mr. Bower include recording at the Aaron Copland School of Music at Queens College for Pipedreams Radio Broadcast in October 2004, playing Widor's *Opus 42 Symphony in g minor* with the South Shore Symphony of Rockville Centre, and performing on the famed Cavaillé Coll organ at the Cathedral of Notre Dame, Paris, in July of 2005. In 2007, he performed a solo organ recital at Westminster Abbey, London. In January of 2008, he hosted the Conference of Cathedral Music Directors of the United States and Canada at St. Agnes Cathedral and presented a number of choirs and soloists in concert. That February, he performed Samuel Barber's organ concerto *Toccata Festiva* with the South Shore Symphony and Schola Cantorum. More recent events include taking The Choir of Men and Boys on a singing tour to Washington, D.C., teaching a choral conducting seminar at Mount St. Mary's College in Los Angeles. Three years ago, he founded a new Diocesan Boys Choir of 45 select young singers and performed organ concerto works at St. Peter's Church, Citicorp Center in 2011. In 2011, he prepared and conducted the Cathedral Choirs in a performance of John Rutter's *Requiem*, and recorded a new Christmas CD with the Choir of Men and Boys and Diocesan Boys Choir. In July of 2013, he took 100 singers from the Cathedral Choirs and Diocesan Boys Choir on a 10-Day Tour of Italy.

Recent projects included taking a select ensemble of singers to perform in the Hallmark Christmas Concert at St. Patrick's Cathedral, Fifth Avenue, New York City, presenting the Brahms *Requiem* and Mozart *Mass* with professional soloists and orchestra, and the concert tour to Ireland/England for 2015! Events in 2015/16: conducting again Handel's "Messiah," and taking the Choirs to perform at Carnegie Hall.

The 2016-2017Season found Maestro Bower conducting the 9/11 Memorial Concert of John Rutter's "Requiem," taking the Cathedral Choirs to perform at St. Francis Xavier Parish, New York City, preparing the Cathedral Choirs for a performance of Beethoven's "9th Symphony." and taking the Choir of Men and Boys, and Diocesan Boys and Teens Choir to perform the National Anthem at Citifield, and the Long Island Ducks.

Special endeavors for 2017-2018: performing Poulenc's "Organ Concerto," and the Cathedral Choirs performance of Mozart's "Requiem" in St. Stephen's Cathedral, Vienna! 2018-2019: Conducting a recording of Mozart's "Requiem" performance; to be aired on TV, Chanel 13!
