From the Pastor's Desk



EVANGELIZING NOT IMPOSING

This Wednesday is the memorial of the North American Martyrs. This feast commemorates the 8 Jesuit Martyrs who were among the first martyrs of North America.

Their Shrine, the National Shrine of the North American Martyrs located in Auriesville, New York, is my favorite shrine in the United States. I recommend every parishioner to make a pilgrimage there. In previous letters, I wrote much about the Shrine itself. In this letter, I would like to share with you about how you can evangelize as they did.

It is quite evident that it is not easy being a Catholic who believes in the faith and moral teachings of the Church. Let's face it, chastity, respect for the dignity of the unborn, and other moral teachings are no longer mainstream beliefs.

Recently, Bishop Robert Baron made an online presentation of the 4 great philosophers of the modern era that greatly impacted the mindset of mainstream culture. It is titled: *Ideas Have Consequences: The Philosophers Who Shaped 2020.* I encourage you to watch this very informative presentation. These philosophers include Karl Marx, Friedrich Nietzsche, Jean-Paul Sartre, and Michael Foucault. What is similar with their philosophical ideas is that it is based in atheism. Therefore, you can deduce that our culture is atheistic.

So how can we evangelize the culture? The answer is giving people the love of Jesus Christ. That doesn't necessarily mean to give that love through words. Doing corporal and spiritual works of mercy is one of the best ways we can give the love of Christ to others. Saints Mother Teresa and John Paul II are wonderful examples of this.

It may be necessary that one may have to speak and say yes or no to certain things. During the month of October, which is Respect for Life Month, let us pray for doctors, nurses, and for lawmakers. These days there are bills that may be passed in our state and throughout the country that would force Catholic doctors and nurses to do procedures that go completely against their Catholic moral teachings. If it came to that, moral Catholic doctors would have to say no.

So how we can be a voice of Jesus Christ to the culture?

- Give the love of Jesus through spiritual and corporal works of mercy. This is the heart of
 evangelization. It is not through convincing arguments or imposing someone to believe
 our Catholic Faith. Rather it is offering our love for Jesus to others.
- In a conversation, instead of being that person who speaks up right away on a certain moral issue rather remain silent. What you don't say or don't condone can be a kinder and gentler way to defend the faith rather than hysterically blasting a belief that goes against the faith? People can tell where you stand in a certain topic if you don't agree with them by being silent. If you are with someone who is willing to listen to you respectfully, then it would be helpful if you speak up in a respectful way.
- Don't be afraid to say no to certain things that go against the Catholic Faith. As Christians, we offer ourselves to Christ in a love that is sacrificial. Saying no to certain things is also sacrificial.
- Try to learn a little about modern philosophy. I know this sounds daunting. Online videos from Bishop Barron's *Word on Fire* and Fr. Michael Schmitz are very helpful in understanding it. The North American Martyrs tried to understand the culture that they evangelized to.
- Offering a smile to someone especially to someone that you disagree or even dislike is a simple way to give the peace of Jesus.
- Pray. A great daily prayer to say is the Prayer of St. Francis. Spend more time with Jesus
 in the Blessed Sacrament. Read daily from the Bible especially the Gospels. Through a
 strong spiritual prayer life, giving the love of Jesus becomes more natural to us.

It's not easy being a Catholic. Jesus does not give us an easy life. As we journey to Heaven, He gives us the Cross and His loving presence on Earth. Christ gives us all that we need to be His voice. Let us stay faithful.

Jesus told his disciples a parable about the necessity for them to pray always without becoming weary. He said, "There was a judge in a certain town who neither feared God nor respected any human being. And a widow in that town used to come to him and say, 'Render a just decision for me against my adversary.' For a long time the judge was unwilling, but eventually he thought, 'While it is true that I neither fear God nor respect any human being, because this widow keeps bothering me I shall deliver a just decision for her lest she finally come and strike me.'"

The Lord said, "Pay attention to what the dishonest judge says. Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night? Will he be slow to answer them? I tell you, he will see to it that justice is done for them speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

New Guidelines for Child Care Assistance

Starting August 1, 2022, Households with incomes up to 300% of the State Income Standard are eligible for the child care subsidy program. For example, a family of 2 with a household income of \$54,930 or a family of 4 with household income up to \$83,250 can apply for child care assistance. Applications can be submitted through the local Nassau or Suffolk Department of Social Services or by mail.
